In 2021, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Los Angeles Council (SVdPLA) continued to push through the challenges of the global pandemic and remained an essential resource for our community. Our Conferences of Charity provided immediate and emergency aid, ranging from feeding and providing families with essentials such as clothing and furniture to preventing homelessness through utility and rental assistance.

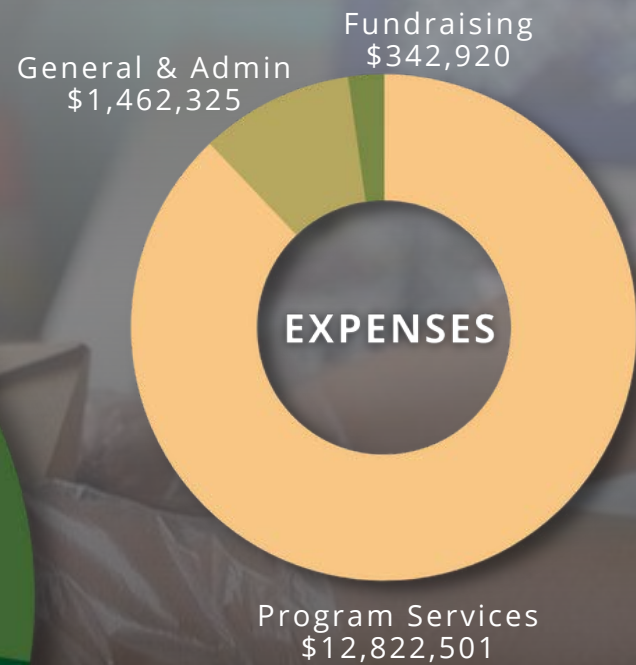
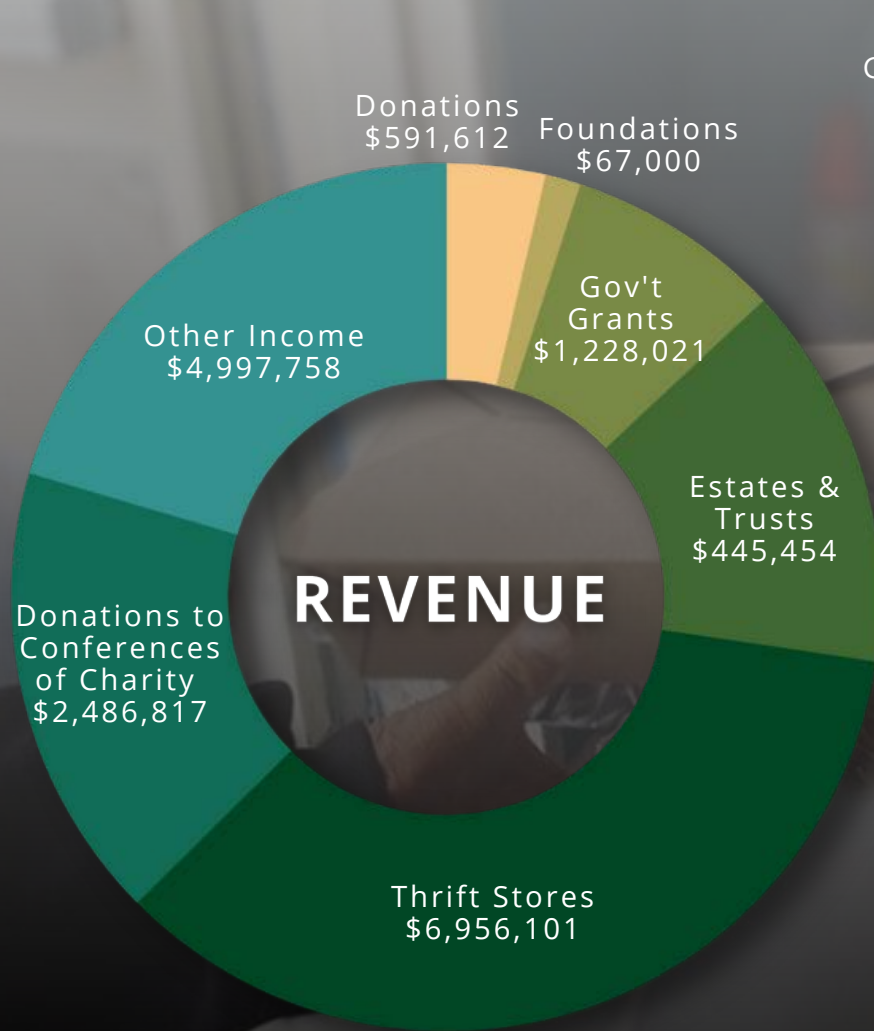
