Beginning to pray the Rosary

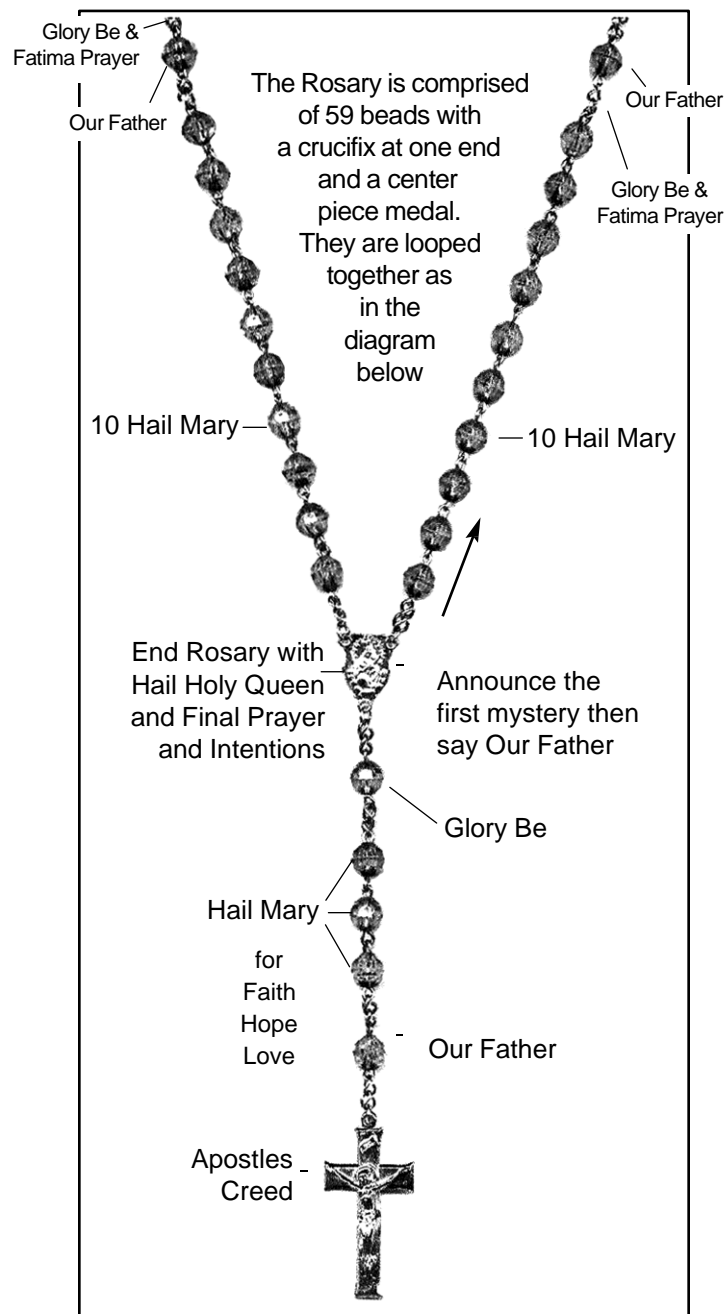
1. Make the Sign of the Cross
2. Say the Apostles Creed
3. The Our Father is said on each of the divider beads.
4. The Hail Mary is recited on each of the grouped beads.
5. The Glory Be To The Father is said after the three Hail Mary’s at the beginning of the Rosary and after each decade of the grouped beads.
6. The Fatima Prayer is said after each decade.
7. Reflect on the Mysteries of each decade.
8. The Hail Holy Queen prayer is said at the end of the Rosary on the centerpiece medal.
9. **At End of Rosary:**
For the general and missionary intentions of the Pope - we pray: Lord hear our prayer!
For the prayer intentions of the Church, the Society, and the poor - we pray: Lord hear our prayer!

The Apostle’s Creed

Sorrowful Mysteries

“Tuesday & Friday”

Agony in the Garden

You were alone and thinking by Yourself. After all Your hard work, things weren't going right. The pressure was so great like the Scripture said; You felt you were “sweating blood”! When you experience pressure in your Vincentian ministry, do you take time like Jesus to pray? Recall a situation.

Scourging at the Pillar

People can be cruel to us because of our efforts to help the poor and needy. We often take “verbal beatings”. If Christ could endure physical pain, let us ask His help to endure our mental pain during these verbal scourgings.

Crowning with Thorns

That crown of thorns had many piercing thorns...each causing Jesus physical pain. The pain was also mental. Name or become aware of the thorns, the mental anguish which caused you mental pain as you tried to help one of Christ's needy.

Carrying the Cross

As Vincentians we can truly relate to Jesus' burden. The “cross carrying” of trying to help needy people: not enough money or food, pain of knowing you can't help more, the heavy burden of the “con artists” making us fall at times, and/or making uncharitable mistakes. Dear Jesus, help us get up and carry the many different crosses which come our way.

Jesus Dies on the Cross

When we feel frustrated and our ministry to God's poor is “killing us”! Let's trust God, Our Father. Let's imitate Jesus by pleading, “Father into your hands, I commend my Spirit.” Let go. Let God.

Glorious Mysteries

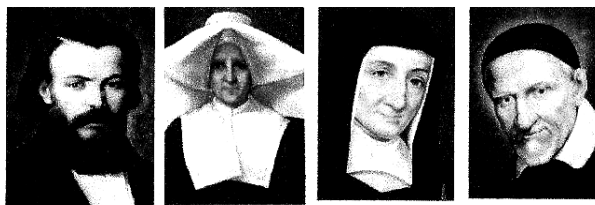
“Wednesday & Sunday”

Resurrection

Name a time, an incident, or a situation which after all your efforts and good work, you felt failure and frustrated. Then in almost an instant, things changed and worked out. You just experienced the joy of Jesus' Resurrection, your own resurrection experience.

Ascension

Jesus has returned to Heaven...victorious. Before He left, He challenged us to preach the Gospel, feed the poor, and clothe the naked, visit the lonely. Now you have a very powerful SOMEONE whom you know personally. Be confident that Jesus will answer your prayers “in His good time”.

Descent of the Holy Spirit

Be HAPPY!! You now have a link between Heaven and Earth. You have someone next to Jesus to intercede and plead your case to Jesus. IT WORKS. Recall the Wedding Feast of Cana.

Joyful Mysteries

“Monday & Saturday”

The Annunciation

Mary is unexpectedly surprised when she is asked and accepts the new task and responsibility to become the mother of Jesus, our Savior. Many times as Vincentians we, too are surprised by those in need. May we, too, like Mary, say “YES” and make Christ present in their lives by our charity.

The Visitation

In order to visit her older cousin Elizabeth, who was six months pregnant with John the Baptist, Mary had to travel over 80 miles to do her act of charity. What were her thoughts and feelings as she traveled? What are our thoughts and feelings as we go to visit our friends needing help?

The Birth of Jesus

Have you ever thought that by your charitable work as a Vincentian, you are responsible for “birthing Jesus” for the first time in the lives of some of our friends? Recall an incident. What was Mary's joy in giving Christ to the world? What is your joy?

The Presentation

Mary and Joseph take Jesus to the Temple to be dedicated to God. When we go to Church for Mass or just for a visit, do we take our “Jesus-Friend” with us to seek God's help and guidance for them?

Finding the Child Jesus in the Temple

Problems happen in all families...even in the Holy Family. In our Vincentian family, we too will have problems at times. Like Mary and Joseph, may we seek Jesus, and then like Jesus, grow in wisdom, grace, and understanding. What problem do we now have which we need to seek Jesus' help?

Luminous Mysteries

Jesus' Baptism in the Jordan

Did you ever wonder if you had anything in common with Jesus? Yes, you are both human and you both are BAPTIZED! You have a special relationship with God the Father like Jesus. You both are committed to His work and way of life. Develop the ease and the comfort to talk to Jesus, your baptized brother. Have that same ease to talk with your baptized Vincentians as you do the work of God.

Wedding Feast at Cana

Did you ever stop to think that Jesus liked to go to parties? Here Jesus is celebrating and having fun at a wedding like you do. Is your Vincentian Ministry fun? Is there a way you can make it more fun and enjoyable? Ask Jesus to come party with you.

Proclamation of the Kingdom

“Preach the Gospel to all nations,” Jesus commands us as Vincentians. We do this by our many and various acts of charity. How do we use our voice to invite unchurched friends to join our faith? Are we afraid, ashamed, or don't know how? Ask Jesus for help. After all He is the one who COMMANDED us to do that.

The Transfiguration

Jesus' human body has been transformed on the mountain before the Apostles. As Vincentians how has your life been transformed? Name the changes. Don't be afraid. Are you more charitable, understanding, generous, or self sacrificing and closer to Christ? Naming these changes is not being proud. You are praising God for helping you “become a better you.”

The Gift of the Holy Eucharist

Isn't it draining, tiring, sometimes even boring to do Vincentian work? Don't we feel exhausted at times? This is reality. This is normal. This is what it means to be a Vincentian! Jesus knows that! He calls: “Come to Me all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you.” Do you believe that? Jesus says He will empower you with His Own Body and Blood, even daily, if you wish. How often do you accept His invitation?
